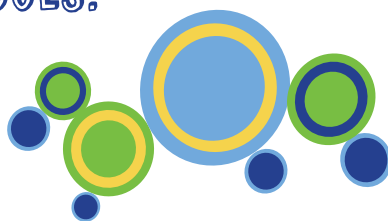
In this booklet we would like to share with you the services we can offer here at Freebrough to enrich your school curriculum and inspire your young learners.

We provide this service free of charge and the majority of sessions are held here in the Academy where students can access our state of the art facilities. Please see the back page of this leaflet for details on how to book.

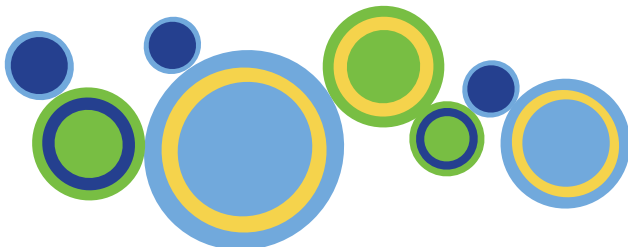

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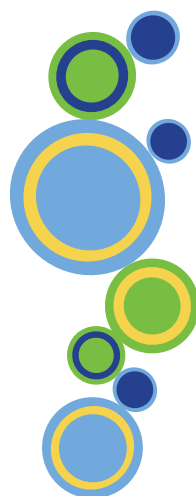
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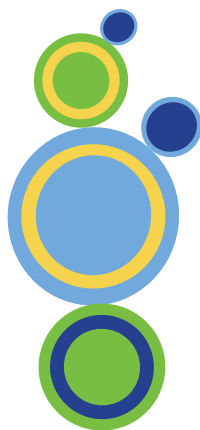

BUSINESS & ENTERPRISE

Workshop Title	Zenny's Enterprise Masterclass
Description	<p>Freebrough mascot Zenny Zeebrough is here to teach students about the enterprise skills with engaging and hands on activities, where students experience how to set up a business in a fast paced environment.</p> <p>Year 5 and 6 students are invited to take part in separate sessions.</p>
What will the students learn?	<p>Students will be able to :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and explain the enterprise skills • Demonstrate the enterprise skills being used • Understand the different stages to business start-up
Maximum student numbers	1 primary year group
Duration	1.5-2 hours



Workshop Title	Zenny's Den – an inter primary enterprise challenge
Description	All feeder primary schools will be invited to select a team of students to take part in a one day enterprise challenge. Students will be set a task during the day and supported to complete the task by business and enterprise staff. The day will culminate in students presenting their ideas to Zenny's judging panel.
What will the students learn?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communicate and present ideas clearly • Be able to develop a business idea/solve a problem • Be able to work effectively in a team, allocating roles and responsibilities
Maximum student numbers	5 per primary school
Duration	One day

ENGLISH

Workshop Title	Exploring and Explaining Language
Description	Using fiction or non-fiction texts, students will study an extract of a text and develop their skills in language analysis.
What will the students learn?	Students will learn how explore and explain the effect of language in deeper detail.
Maximum student numbers	15
Duration	Three one hour sessions



MATHS

Workshop Title	Maths Masterclass
Description	Developing Level 6 maths skills.
What will the students learn?	Develop maths skills including number, algebra, problem-solving.
Maximum student numbers	30
Duration	1 hour per session

SCIENCE

Bath Bombs

Students are able to make their very own fizzing, exploding bath bomb.



Make Jelly Babies Scream!

See first hand what different colours burning metals have in this practical. See how much energy is contained in one gummy sweet in our explosive screaming jelly baby practical.

Bouncy Balls

Use simple PVA glue and borax to make a bouncy polymer that can be stretched, shaped and coloured in. Messy and hands on, students can take their polymer with them at the end.



Elephant Toothpaste

Using a few chemicals and some everyday items you can transform an ordinary bottle into exploding foam which resembles toothpaste being squeezed out of the bottle.

Van de Graaff Generator

Fancy finding out who is the best electrical conductor is in your class? Want to light a Bunsen burner with your finger or see who has the biggest hair? This is for you!



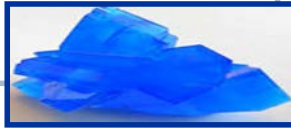
Elephant Toothpaste

(FOAMING SCIENCE EXPERIMENT)



Crystal Garden and Volcanoes

Can you make your volcano hit the laboratory roof? See who has the skills to make the biggest eruption. Also learn about how crystals are formed in cooling rocks.



Gas Testing

How do scientists know which invisible gas is which? Practice how to make and test for carbon dioxide, oxygen and hydrogen gases.



Grass Heads

Fill the foot part of a tight with grass seeds and saw dust. Using elastic bands, beady eyes and lead piping wire you can add accessories to your grass head character. Leave your grass head sitting in water and watch it sprout some hair when the grass seeds germinate. Easy, fun and you get to take it home!



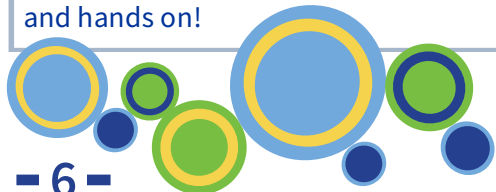
Rainbow Fizz

Observe the chemistry of acids and alkalis in this hands on experiment that demonstrates their chemical reactions and the role of indicator chemicals.



Poo Experiment

Use a plastic bag, the leg of a pair of tights, bread, gravy, sweetcorn and kidney beans to model the whole process of digestion from start to ahem... finish. This is messy and hands on!



MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES

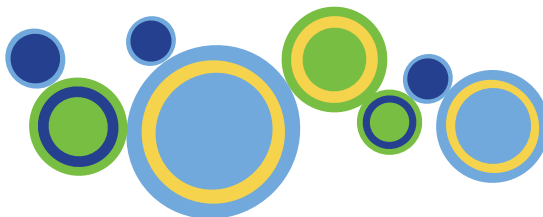
Workshop Title	Inter-Primary Language Championships

What will the students learn?	<p>Students will be able to:</p> <p>Work independently to learn a range of new vocabulary in up to 30 different languages or you could focus on the language offered in your school. The students will be addicted to this kind of interactive language learning in the main language skills and discover the languages they love.</p>
Maximum student numbers	50 free student places per school worth £150 if you quote ISSACG when registering for the competitions online www.languageperfect.com .
Duration	The competitions are 10 days long but the students do most of the competing in their free time where they have access to the internet and maybe one/two lessons during the week at the discretion of the class teacher.



Workshop Title	Spanish Master Classes: Led by Freebrough Academy Language Leaders
Description	After school sessions offered by language leaders (Y9-11 students) supervised by teaching staff to give feeder primary students a flavour of what they will be doing in Spanish when they join Freebrough.
What will the students learn?	Initially, how to greet and introduce themselves in Spanish, becoming more confident at speaking. If several sessions are attended by the same pupils then their vocabulary will be developed further in a fun and interactive manner.
Most appropriate times to run the workshop	Tuesday after the school day e.g. 3-4pm
Maximum student numbers	20
Duration	1 hour per session

Duration	1 hour per session

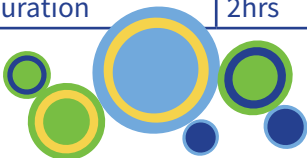
ICT

Workshop Title	Movie Trailer in a Day
Description	Students will plan the story for a film and then create a trailer for their film. They will review existing trailers, identify success criteria then use the HD video cameras and green screen to film elements of their film. They will then use iMove on Apple Mac machines to create a trailer.
What will the students learn?	They will learn how to plan filming and they will gain skills in filming and editing using industry standard equipment.
Maximum student numbers	20
Duration	All day

Workshop Title	Finger Puppets
Description	Year 10 students plan the workshop and then deliver it to a primary school group.
What will the students learn?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team work • Creativity • Working with fabrics
Maximum student numbers	30-40
Duration	2hrs

Workshop Title	Natural Hazard Survival Course
Description	Students will consider several challenges presented by natural hazards. Students will work with some of the top Freebrough Geographers to identify and solve problems caused by natural hazards. Can they decide which natural hazard is the worst?
What will the students learn?	Students will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify different natural hazards in the world • Identify different natural hazards in our locality • Evaluate the impact of different natural hazards and justify which hazard they think is the worst
Maximum student numbers	30
Duration	1.5hrs



Workshop Title	Time Detectives
Description	Students will become time detectives investigating a range of artefacts and evidence. They will learn to ask historical questions and solve historical mysteries.
What will the students learn?	Students will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify different types of evidence • Use evidence to solve historical mysteries and work out what happened in the past • Evaluate the quality of different types of evidence
Maximum student numbers	30
Duration	1.5hrs

Workshop Title	Play/Musical in a Day
Description	Students will create a play/musical in a day with a performance to parents at the end of the day.
What will the students learn?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dance, drama, music • Working to a commission • What makes a successful performance? • Confidence
Most appropriate times of the year to run the workshop	End of term or half term
Maximum student numbers	Around 60 students maximum
Duration	All day
